MACINTOSH. The Macintosh was extensively and heavily stained with Human Blood on the right side, both inside and outside, and on the upper inner side of the right sleeve. The outside of the left cuff and a large area near the left pocket were similarly stained.

A considerable portion of the bottom right side of the Macintosh had been recently burnt away. I had visited the house on January 21st, and then formed the conclusion that the Macintosh had been burnt in the Parlour on the night of the murder.

blood had not soaked right through the Hearthrug.

CASH BOX. The Cash Box and <sup>32</sup> Dollar Note were free from Blood.

33 SUIT OF CLOTHES. The Suit was free from blood stains, with the exception of 2 minute old stains in the right hand trousers pocket.

34 <sup>35</sup> The CARPET, TOWEL, LOCK & KEY <sup>22</sup> had no blood stains upon them.

36 SKIRT. At the bottom of the Plaquet there were 3 recent horizontal burns, which could have been caused by contact with the hot fireclay of a Gas Fire such as was in the Parlour at 29 Wolverton Street. The front of the Skirt was heavily stained with Human Blood.

from the "O" in ONE diagonally upwards, there were several Human Blood Smears such as would be caused by drawing a slightly bloodstained thumb across the Note. These Smears were of recent origin, and were consistent with having been made on January 20th.
